In today's world, women have shown their capability in various sectors and successfully carried all kinds of responsibilities, including in the maritime industry.

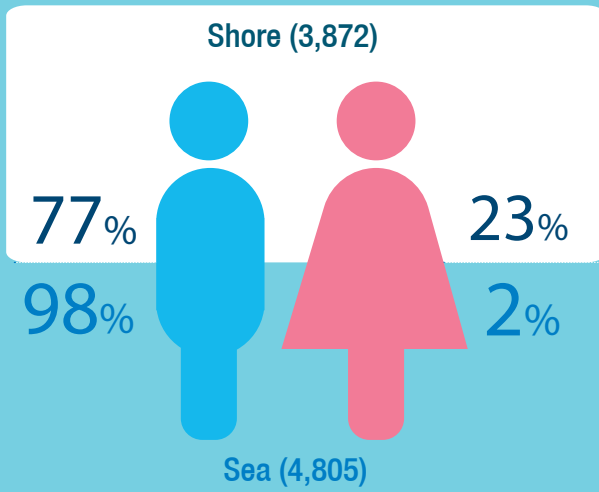
While this has always been a traditionally male dominated field, the entry of women in the seafaring workforce is a growing trend.
